12. Project Updates (City Manager Paul Dyal)

Mr. Dyal reported on the following items:

Annie Mattox Park:

Still waiting on the lighting and the concrete poles. The project has \$13,250 remaining balance.

Ms. Young requested releasing the remaining balance to the Annie Mattox Board to get some small projects and improvements completed such as water fountains and benches.

Per Mr. Kennon, he recommended placing an amendment to the agreement on next month's agenda.

Mr. Sampson spoke in opposition of releasing additional funds to Annie Mattox Park, and suggested a reimbursement mechanism. He reported not being in support of any funding until a background check was completed.

Mr. Jernigan spoke in support of background checks and getting improvements made.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Vanessa George

Mr. Kennon stated the agreement with Annie Mattox defines the project as resurfacing basketball and tennis courts and improving court lighting. If funds are needed in excess of those identified projects, he recommended members make a motion to modify the agreement to utilize the remaining funds and to identify with specificity the projects and or improvements the excess funding would be spent on.

Gwen Lake:

Met with Suwannee River Water Management District (SRWMD) to discuss pre-app for permit and any available grant funding.

Lake Montgomery Pier:

Fencing has been ordered.

Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) is finalizing the bid package for pier construction.

SR47/I75 WW Improvements Project

Project is complete.

SR 47 RV Park Extension

Change order is being drafted.

Bell Road

60% deliverable is planned for 8/31.

Sallie Mae Jerry Park:

Cameras have been installed.
Eminent domain process is still ongoing.

Senior Home Repair Project:

County has accepted the third installment. \$750,000 total has been issued.

Memorial Stadium Repairs:

Structural repairs have started. The estimated completion time is three weeks.

Patterson Avenue Resurfacing

Since the award of this project, it has been challenging to coordinate the railroad flaggers for the project (in this situation, two separate rail lines). No work has begun at this point, but we are anticipating the project to get going within the month, pending the flagger availability.

Sisters Welcome PAR Upgrade

Received final signed and sealed plans.

Mr. Sampson inquired about fencing at Lake Montgomery and recommended a flashing light for entry.

Mr. Kennon updated members on the parking lot for Sallie Mae Jerry Park, and reported he is working with Mr. Johnson on the easement for Annie Mattox Park.

Mr. Hill asked for an update on moving the City of Lake City Welcome sign, Mr. Dyal reported he has not heard back from the property owner.

Ms. Young encouraged members to support improvements at Annie Mattox Park.
